**RELIGIOUS EDUCATION INFORMATION**

Registration forms for the upcoming year will be mailed out  
during the third week of August. Read the form carefully as  
there are a number of changes this year.

1. **Classes start the week of September 13<sup>th</sup>.**
2. We have lowered the fees, a little.
3. **All parishioners pay the same rate.**
4. All forms will be mailed out at the same time.
5. **There are no Fall/Spring Sessions for K-8.**
6. All K-8 classes run from September-April.
7. **K-8 classes take place on Sundays or Tuesdays.**
8. The curriculum is based on the Sunday readings.
9. **All youth will use a Bible as their textbook.**
10. We will provide each child with a Bible.
11. **Thank you to the anonymous donor who purchased the bibles for us.**
12. Youth who attend a Catholic school or youth who are academically home schooled with a Catholic based home school program are not required by the Diocese of Manchester to attend Religious Education classes *unless they are in the second or tenth grade. These youth are required by the Diocese of Manchester to be prepared for the Sacraments, and to celebrate the Sacraments, with the Church the family is registered in.*

### SINGLE AGAIN AND ANNULMENTS

Sometimes life does not play out as expected. However, through the healing process of the separated, divorced, and widowed we can witness God's love. Through the invalidity process, the divorced can experience God's healing love. We want to help you through that process and serve as a resource for any questions you may have.

The first step is to contact your Parish Priest, Deacon, or Pastoral Associate to make an appointment to complete a Petition for the Declaration of an Invalid Marriage. This can only be done upon completion of a civil divorce. All parishes in the diocese are supplied with petitions. Be sure to provide complete documentation and accurate information while filling out the petition. The judges have the right to reject a petition if there does not appear to be any grounds, or if an investigation does not appear to be warranted by the petitioner's statements.

The Office will be closed on Tuesday, August 4<sup>th</sup> for the Staff outing. We will reopen on Wednesday, August 5<sup>th</sup>.

August 2, 2015

#### First Reading: Exodus 16:2-4; 12-15

God tests His chosen people's allegiance to Him. After they have "grumbled" against Moses and Aaron, their leaders, God provides them with miraculous manna and quail. He also instructs the people on how to handle their gifts.

#### Second Reading: Ephesians 4:17, 20-24

St. Paul urges his readers to live and act in the light of their baptism into Christ. That sacrament enables them to "put on the new self" and put away the old one. Their decision has consequences.

#### Gospel: John 6:24-35

In His dialogue with the crowd that has followed Him, Jesus tells them that faith is the key to doing "the works of God." Their faith in Him as the one who was sent leads them also to believe that He is the true bread that came down from heaven to feed them. Not only them, but the whole world.
