Registration forms for the upcoming year will be mailed out during the third week of August. Read the form carefully as there are a number of changes this year.

1. **Classes start the week of September 13<sup>th</sup>.**
2. We have lowered the fees, a little.
3. **All parishioners pay the same rate.**
4. All forms will be mailed out at the same time.
5. **There are no Fall/Spring Sessions for K-8.**
6. All K-8 classes run from September-April.
7. **K-8 classes take place on Sundays or Tuesdays.**
8. The curriculum is based on the Sunday readings.
9. **All youth will use a Bible as their textbook.**
10. We will provide each child with a Bible.
11. **Thank you to the anonymous donor who purchased the bibles for us.**
12. Youth who attend a Catholic school or youth who are academically home schooled with a Catholic based home school program are not required by the Diocese of Manchester to attend Religious Education classes *unless they are in the second or tenth grade. These youth are required by the Diocese of Manchester to be prepared for the Sacraments, and to celebrate the Sacraments, with the Church the family is registered in.*
13. **Please provide baptism certificates for youth who are new to our program and were not baptized at St Jude Church.**

**First Reading: Proverbs 9:1-6**

Personified Wisdom sends out her "banquet invitations" to the "simple" people. "House" here stands for her followers, even the whole world. The banquet symbolizes her teaching.

**Second Reading: Ephesians 5:15-20** Paul contrasts the lifestyle of the foolish with that of the wise. He urges his readers to live a Spirit-filled life and in this way learn the will of the Lord.

**Gospel: John 6:51-58**

The Bread of Life discourse continues. Jesus dispels any doubt that He is speaking literally about eating His flesh and drinking His blood. The gift of His remaining in us who do is incomparable wisdom.
