**RETURNING THE GIFTS:**

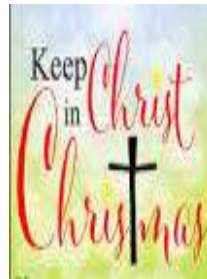

### REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK OF November 15, 2015

#### First Reading: Daniel 12:1-3

This remarkable passage contains the earliest pronouncement in Scripture about belief in the resurrection of the dead, stating clearly that "those who sleep in the dust shall live forever."

#### Second Reading: Hebrews 10:11-14, 18

The one sacrifice of Christ far surpasses in worth and merit those ongoing sacrifices of the earthbound Hebrew priests who offer them daily. Besides, their sacrifices "can never take away sins.

#### Gospel: Mark 13:24-32

The signs accompanying Jesus' return come from Old Testament writings. His arrival at the end of time will be proof of His victory over sin and death. The natural life processes of the fig tree are a guide to the events leading to the Son of Man's return.
