WEDNESDAY**

Ash Wednesday falls on February 18th this year. Masses will be held at 8:00AM and 7:00PM only. **A reminder**, ashes will only be distributed within the context of Mass.

REGULATIONS FOR FAST AND ABSTINENCE

These are days of fast and abstinence.

Ash Wednesday, February 18th
Good Friday, April 3rd
FRIDAYS OF LENT are also days of abstinence.

FASTING is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

ABSTINENCE is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

HEALTH REMINDER TO PARENTS

First Reading: Job 7:1-4, 6-7

In this soliloquy, Job unhappily compares human life to the work of a day laborer or a slave, both of which were wretched states of life. His human friends having failed him, he is downhearted and so he appeals to God.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

Paul accepts the limitations on his freedom and says he preaches out of obligation. Since he is a true apostle, he can share in the fruits of the gospel only by bringing it to others.

Gospel: Mark 1:29-39

Jesus cures Peter's mother-in-law, sure proof that he was a married man at the time of his call. The significant but short visit to Capernaum concludes with the healing of many more people. Jesus then leaves to pray alone, and insists that He must move on to other locales to fulfill His mission.
