First Reading: I Samuel 3:3b-10, 19

A young Samuel hears the Lord calling in the night, and when prompted by Eli, responds to the third call by saying “Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.”

Second Reading: I Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20

Casual sex was rampant in the community, which Paul had to fight against by a powerful statement that “our bodies are not our own,” and are instead temples of the Lord.

Gospel: John 1:35-42

Right at the start of His public ministry, Jesus attracts people. His cousin John the Baptist directs his own disciple Andrew, the brother of Peter, to Jesus by calling Him “the Lamb of God.” When they meet, Andrew and his unnamed friend hear Jesus ask: “What are you looking for?”

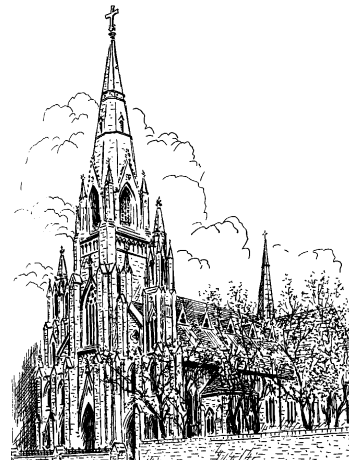
