First Reading: Exodus 20:1-17a, or Exodus 20:1-3, 7-8, 12-17

Second Reading: I Corinthians 1:22-25

Jewish ideas of a Messiah, and Gentile obsession with things rational are both confounded by a crucified Christ. Yet Paul will preach no less to both groups.

Gospel: John 2:13-25

John puts this incident early in his gospel. Jesus expresses righteous anger and rightfully demands respect for His Father's house. He justifies His dramatic action by the fact of His yet to happen resurrection.

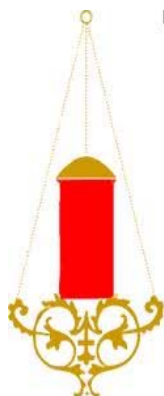

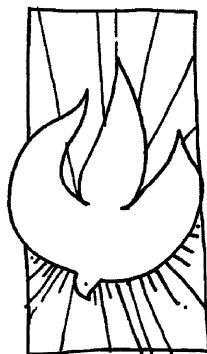


SANCTUARY LAMP
